

## MOSCOW BOROUGH COUNCIL

### PUBLIC HEARING - FEBRUARY 6, 2017 MEETING

---

A public hearing was held on February 6, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. at the Moscow Borough Building, 123 VanBrunt Street, Moscow, PA. The following Council members were either present or absent:

Also present were Constance Sanko (Secretary/Treasurer) and Dhasukerven Shah, Projesh Shah, Noah Condit, and Attorney Patrick Hughes (all representing Moscow Beer and Deli, LLC).

**Public Hearing (Moscow Beer and Deli, LLC):** A public hearing was held at 6:30 p.m. prior to the Council meeting for the purpose of hearing public comment on the transfer of an Intermunicipal Transfer of Liquor License R-928 from Ken and Joyce, LLC, 80 South Main Street, Archibald to Moscow Beer and Deli, LLC , 206 South Main Street.

Noah Condit, Manager, and Attorney Patrick Hughes (representing Moscow Beer and Deli, LLC) explained that the license will be used for the purpose of selling carry out only 6 and 12 packs of beer. The following issues were discussed:

- There will be no entertainment.
- The area which is now used for storage will be renovated for an exclusive area to sell the beer.
- There will be a separate register.
- There will be a central entrance to the building.
- There will be an additional staff person to be trained exclusively for selling the beer, who can only sell if they have a certificate.
- The hours of operating will be limited as required by the Liquor Control Board, most likely from 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- The Pennsylvania State Liquor Control Board has strict regulations.

Moscow Beer and Deli will have to apply for a Building Permit and Zoning Permit and submit to David Lamm, Building Inspector/Zoning Officer for approval.

There were no objections expressed for this transfer to take place.

**Adjournment:** Marc Gaughan made a motion to adjourn the hearing. Bill Heim seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.
